5 years after its release it is still known as one of the greatest films of all time to this day. The movie made \$640.5 million worldwide in its first weekend. That made it the biggest opening weekend ever, and it became the fastest movie to make a billion worldwide, doing so in a mere 11 days. first superhero film to gross over \$2 billion worldwide, breaking numerous box office records, and becoming the highest-grossing film of 2018 and the fourth highest-grossing film at the time of its release both worldwide and in the United States and Canada. It was rated 85% by Rotten Tomatoes, 8.4/10 by IMDb, 5/5 by Film Magazine Empire and is one the most iconic films to have ever been released.
