How to ski a basic guide

First of all, there are very basic terms that will help: parallel skiing and snowplough.

Snowplough is a term used when you are it is the first skill taught. To snowplough successfully you have to bend your legs onto the front of your boots and keep your back straight while bringing the tips of your skis together into a v-shape like a pizza slice. This will help you slow down but if you want to stop you need to start snowplough it quite a bit in advance to stop successfully.

Parallel skiing is slightly harder but once you have got the hang of it, it's very easy to then progress to a parallel stop – stopping without using snowplough and more precisely. To parallel ski, you must keep your legs straight like uncooked spaghetti and you will gain a lot of speed quite fast especially if you crouch down into your boots and stay low down – aerodynamics and all that – but this takes practice and takes a while to master.
