#### **Feedback**

- In 2024 97% of Sheldon students, who were able to, went out on placement
- 97% of students said WEX was worth doing
- 96% of students said they enjoyed their week
- 72% of students felt that their confidence in dealing with adults had improved
- 75% of students felt that their self confidence had improved



### **Changing times**

- No work experience took place in 2020 ⊗
- In 2021 we had a mixture of physical and virtual placements
- Since 2022 the majority of students go out on a physical placement, but some still preferred to do a virtual placement
- Many of the virtual opportunities are in the holidays or at weekends so some students did both a virtual placement AND a physical placement



- Save unlimited shortlists to refer back to later




