How to Look for a Lost Dog - Ann M Martin



Every Day - David Levithan



Frankenstein - Mary Shelley






Treasure Island - Robert Louis Stevenson








The Maze Runner - James Dashner

Egg and Spoon - Gregory Maguire



Mud, Sweat and Tears - Bear Grylls





The Colour of Magic (discworld book 1) - Terry Pratchett




come with being a refugee.

Together they join a gang of homeless street boys who survive only by mutual bonds of trust and total dependence on each other.

Jung-ling's family considers her bad luck because her mother died giving birth to her. They are cruel to her. This story is one of survival in the light of cruelty and disloyalty and with the help of kindness from others.

Flamingo Boy - Michael Morpurgo




