<b>1</b> 19.02.24	Create a collaged piece for your project. This can be using photographs you have taken, magazine and newspaper clippings, painted pieces of paper/ card you have created. Check out: Michel Keck, Ryota Kikuchi, John Stezaker, John Piper	Create a view finding of your collage. This can be in any media you desire.	Annotate your collage. Link with an artist where necessary.
<b>2</b> 26.02.24	Create a research page on an artist of your choice.	Create a direct copy of their work in your choice of media	Create an 'in the style of' for this artist with annotations.
<b>3</b> 04.03.24	Create a piece of artwork relevant to your exam question/topic on a different canvas. This should not be white cartridge or printer paper. You could use envelopes, coloured paper, scrumpled paper, paper you have woven together, corrugated cardboard etc.	Create an image of your choice and explore a new media. (New or previous design)	Re-create this image using watercolour. Create swatches of watercolour showcasing different techniques on your page i.e. dry on dry, wet on dry, wet on wet, salt on wet, bleeding colours etc.
<b>4</b> 11.03.24	Draw from primary observation. Include as much detail as you can taking consideration of line, tone, form, shape.	Create an image in acrylic, gouache or oil paint. This should be at a larger scale than your sketchbook and force you to work outside of it. Create swatches of colour to add to your sketchbook.	Photograph and annotate your painting.
<b>5</b> 18.03.24	Conduct another photoshoot to help you gain further primary sources for your development and final outcome for the 10 hours timed exam. This photoshoot should be no less than 20 images.	Draw one of your photographs no smaller than A5. This should be in pencil or charcoal. Annotate this drawing and explain how this will help with your final idea.	Create another drawing of the photograph only using coloured pencils. Experiment with depth and tone. Create multiple smaller studies.

<b>6</b> 25.03.24	Create a research page on an artists that will help inspire your final outcome for the 10 hour exam.	Create a direct copy of their work in your choice of media	Create an 'in the style of' for this artist with annotations. Explain how this artist will inspire your final outcome.
Easter Break	Create a page in your book showing refinement of your chosen media for your final outcome. This should include showing a variety of colours, methods and techniques using this media with accompanying annotations to explain thoughts/ ideas, processes, likes, dislikes etc. Create a study of a potential image for your final outcome. This should be in your pencil. Include annotations.	Create a double page spread of possible composition and layout ideas for your final piece. This should include thumbnail sketches, written thoughts, photographs for reference, artists work for reference and inspiration	Create a mock version of your final outcome. Time yourself for 10 hours (this should be split over 2 days). Make notes of any time discrepancies (under or over!), any adjustments, any issues, any tweaks etc.
