Dear Parents and Carers,

As we come to the end of the spring term, it's a great opportunity to reflect on the hard work, achievements, and progress our students have made over the past few weeks of term 4. From academic successes to sporting triumphs and creative endeavours, it has been wonderful to see our school community thrive. With the days getting longer and lighter, we look forward to the opportunities that the summer term will bring.

New Fencing

Over the **Easter holiday**, new fencing and gates will be installed at the front of the school, between the **PE block, Dance Studio**, **DT blocks**, **and the car park**. This area is currently open, allowing visitors and students to come and go freely. Unfortunately, this has led to visitors and delivery drivers getting lost and ending up in the middle of the school site—something that is not ideal from a **safeguarding perspective**.

To address this, we have decided to **secure the front of the school**. This will also help prevent students from leaving the site during the school day and deter unwanted visitors from entering in the evenings and on weekends.

For students, the gates will be open at the **start and end of the school day as normal**. Sixth Formers will still be able to open the new gate by the main office to exit the site during the day, so they won't notice any significant difference.

Magnetic locks update

As you are aware from my last newsletter we introduced new magnetic locks on the doors in the Humanities, PSRE and English blocks at the start of the term to improve the flow of students around the school. I am pleased to say this has been successful and has improved the movement of students in corridors and has created a calmer atmosphere at busy changeovers. The changes that have been made were viewed favourably, and highlighted as an area of strength by external visitors during a recent site visit by The National Autistic Society. Therefore, the trial will become a permanent update from next term.

Disruption on roads due to Wessex Water works

Starting from Monday 7th April until Friday 9th May 2025, the road between Foscote and Yatton Keynell will be closed. This closure is required to allow Wessex Water to carry out mains laying and associated works. While this will largely affect students using the Coachstyle bus service B1428 we recognise that other parents may use the route to bring children to school. Parents of students who use the B1428 service have been written to with further details.

Attendance

At the start of this term, we welcomed our new Attendance Administrator, Michelle Major, who is now working alongside our Attendance Officer, Lisa Hughes. They are working really hard alongside our pastoral teams to improve student attendance. Please remember to call the school if your child is unwell. If your child requires leave of absence for anything apart from illness, this should be requested using the online leave of absence form on our website, which can be found here. There is no longer a paper form. We will then reply to you by email. Please note that we are not allowed to authorise any holiday requested in term time, as this is not permitted under the DfE guidance that was published in August 2024. Thank you for your understanding with this.

Our Science department recently took several teams to compete in the **National Flying Start Challenge**, with two of them advancing to the **Regional Finals**, where they secured **2nd and 3rd place**. During the event, the teams participated in a day of engineering challenges organized by **AtkinsRéalis**, including a flight test of the gliders they have been perfecting this term. We are incredibly proud of their approach to this challenge, demonstrating outstanding teamwork and a passion for engineering.

Athletic Success

Huge congratulations to Ciaran in Year 10 for winning gold and silver at the inaugural England Athletics U16 Winter Long Throws Championships at Loughborough University, where he achieved two new personal bests—46.41m in discus and 51.83m in hammer!

And finally, a massive well done to Otis in Year 12, who won gold in the high jump at the UK Indoor Athletics Championships in Birmingham. Competing in a senior adult competition, 17-year-old Otis outjumped everyone in the UK, clearing an extraordinary 2.20m. To put this is perspective, 2.24m would have enable him to qualify for the Olympics This outstanding achievement earned him a new personal best and the attention of the national media, including an interview on *Points West*.

Year 11 and 13 Exam Preparation

After a very successful Mock examination period at the start of the term, students have received their results and feedback, so they are now refining their revision in preparation for the summer. I hope the students continue to work hard over the Easter break, but do use the time to get some rest and recovery.

We appreciate that some exams start before **Leavers' Day**, but the evidence suggests that students who stay in school and maintain their normal routines perform better in exams than those who take early study leave. The school will provide revision sessions before school for morning exams and will utilise **Periods 3 and 4** for afternoon exam preparation.

After the **Easter break**, Year 11 students will have the option to complete independent revision during their **PE and PSRE lessons** in computer rooms or on iPads. If your child would like to take advantage of this, please remind them to bring their revision materials for these sessions. These sessions will be supervised by the **school's Leadership Team and subject teachers**.
