



#### BEBRAS CHALLENGE

Every October, BEBRAS (https://www.bebras.uk/) runs its national Computational Thinking Skills Challenge. The Challenge is open to all students and has different levels of challenges for different age groups. This year, for the first time ever, Sheldon students in Year 9 and options classes from Years 10 - 13 entered. Students are tested on their ability to solve a range of problems using logic, which helps them to develop the important Computational Thinking Skills that are vital in Computer Science. It was really pleasing to see the students taking part in the tasks and trying to work out the solutions to these problems.

The official BEBRAS results are now in school and out of 350 students who took part, we achieved the following:

95 students placed in the top 50% nationally 88 students placed in the top 25% nationally

21 students placed in the top 10% nationally (1 of these had a perfect score!)

All of the students who were placed in the top 10% (Gold Award) will have the opportunity to take part in more challenges, linked with Oxford University.

I would like to congratulate all of the students who took part and I am really proud of the results, especially because it is our first year of taking part. I'm really looking forward to next year's results! **Mr Minghella.**
